## Jan Kiely

American Director and Resident Associate Professor of History

### Background and Education:

Prior to joining the Center in September 2007, Kiely was Associate Professor of History and Asian studies at Furman University in Greenville, South Carolina. He directed the Furman-in-China programs at Suzhou University and East China Normal University in Shanghai, was a co-founder of the U.S. State Department Critical Languages Grant funded Furman-Suzhou Intensive Summer Chinese Language Institute, and chaired the Asian Studies Department. He has taught and studied at Central China Normal University, the Chinese University of Hong Kong, the University of Hawaii at Manoa, the University of California, Berkeley, Nanjing University and Harvard University. He is a former Yale-China Fellow, Beijing University Fellow, and National Committee on United States-China Relations Public Intellectuals Program Fellow. Kiely first lived and studied in China at the Number Seven Middle School in Chengdu in 1982-83 and has lived in China, off and on, for nearly ten years. At the Center, Kiely occasionally teaches thesis preparation and history seminars.



Kiely received his B.A. in East Asian studies from Yale University in 1988, an M.A. in Asian history from the University of Hawaii at Manoa in 1993, and a Ph.D. in Chinese history from the University of California, Berkeley in 2001.

Kiely is the author a number of papers, articles and book chapters, including *Spreading the Dharma with the Mechanized Press: New Buddhist Print Cultures in the Modern Chinese Print Revolution, 1865-1949*,” in Christopher A. Reed and Cynthia Brokaw, eds., *Woodblocks to the Internet: Print Culture in China*, Leiden, E.J. Brill, (forthcoming) 2009, and “Performances of Resistance and the Imagined Moral Public: Communist Political Prisoners in China, 1928 -1937,” *Twentieth Century China*, Vol. 29, No. 2, April 2004. He currently is working on two books – a study of prison education and reform programs and a study of urban Buddhist activists and civil society both in early and mid-twentieth century China.

## Jan Kiely

美方主任，历史学副教授

### 工作经历与教育背景:

Jan Kiely 主任于 2007 年 9 月开始在中美中心任职。此前，杨主任曾任位于南卡罗莱纳州格林维尔的弗曼大学历史与亚洲研究的副教授。Kiely 主任曾主持弗曼大学在中国苏州大学和上海华东师范大学的项目，是美国国务院关键语言拨款项目弗曼—苏州汉语强化学习夏季学院的创始人之一，并任亚洲研究系主任。他曾经执教并求学于华中师范大学、香港中文大学、夏威夷大学马诺阿分校、加州大学伯克利分校、南京大学和哈佛大学。他曾是雅礼—中国协会研究员、北京大学研究员，以及中美关系公共知识分子项目国家委员会研究员。杨主任在 1982 到 1983 年就读于中国成都第七中学，并先后在中国生活近十年时间。杨主任在中美中心不定期地从事论文准备课程的教学和组织历史研讨会。

杨主任于 1988 年在耶鲁大学获得东亚研究的学士学位，于 1993 年在夏威夷大学马诺阿分校获得亚洲历史研究的硕士学位，于 2001 年在加州大学伯克利分校获得中国历史学的博士学位。
